3 Key Benefits of Data Interoperability in K-12 Education

Some districts are adopting open source Ed-Fi Technologies (with an operational data store (ODS) and API) to create a custom interoperability solution and others are seeking a managed and hosted solution like Data Connect—Certica's interoperability platform based on Ed-Fi. In either scenario, there are 3 key benefits for those school districts that are moving towards data interoperability:



Seamless and secure data exchange. All applications in the K-12 ecosystem need to speak a common language and exchange data in a clearly defined and predictable way. The Ed-Fi Education Data Standard can provide the common language and technologies (ODS and API) to provide predictable ways to transfer data. When using an interoperable solution and education data standard, school districts are no longer tied to a single vendor and can more easily swap out applications that may offer greater value.
