10th Grade Writing Prompt

Read the quotation from English philosopher and author Samuel Johnson and the prompt.

"I have often thought that there has rarely passed a life of which a judicious and faithful narrative would not be useful."

Johnson believed that each person's life has the potential to be the source of an interesting biography. Some people believe biographies should only be written about people who are famous or have achieved great success.

Do you believe each person's life could be material for a biography? Or do you believe that biographies should be written only about those who achieved a measure of fame or success?

Write an essay in which you argue whether all human lives could be the sources for interesting biographies.

REMEMBER: A well-written persuasive text:

- presents a position, uses reasons and evidence to argue the position, and addresses possible counter arguments.
- uses precise and vivid words and specific details for effect and to influence the audience
- argues the position in a manner that is effect for a particular audience
- uses the conventions of spelling, grammar, capitalization and punctuation correctly.

The rubrics are organized by writing domain, address specific elements for each, and provide specific descriptions of student performance at each possible score point level. Because scoring student writing in a consistent, reliable manner can be challenging, Certica also offers support information to help guide the scoring process. It is important to note that the Item Bank writing prompts and scoring materials are designed for informal, formative classroom use and should complement—not replace—any district- or state-provided scoring materials or methods.
